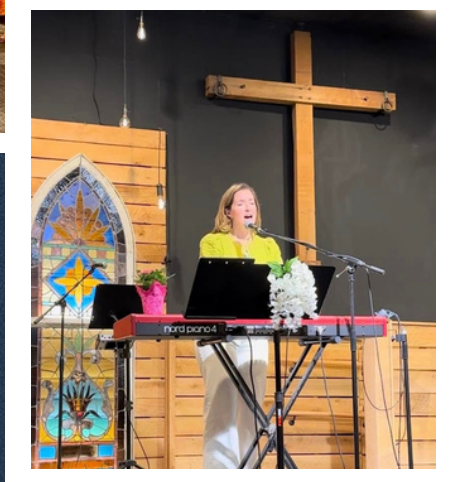

Sundays @4:30 PM is a smaller service that gives another **option** to experience the love of God and be strengthened in your faith before a busy work week!

The evening service will be **similar** to the morning one, just shorter and more intimate. We'll have the same helpful Bible teaching and worshipful space for prayer.

Community is a real value for all of us, so expect to stay after sometimes for light refreshments; some of you may want to grab dinner with friends post-service. **Youth Group** is directly following the service.

We want to **try new things** to **reach more people** with the love of Jesus and provide opportunities for more people to experience the love of God in community.

Will this change the morning service?

No. Nothing about the 10AM service will change. It will remain the primary service for most of our church community.

Will there be Kid's Ministry?

Yes! Children are always important. Our Kid's Director, Lynn Tucker has a small team. We will have only 2 classrooms: 1 for nursery - kindergarten and 1 for elementary age.

How did you come up with this idea?

Through prayer and feedback from staff and leaders. No other (non-Catholic) churches in the area have a Sunday evening service, so this is a unique time offering for folks who want Sunday worship, but not in the morning.

Who should come to this service?

Anyone who would want to!
We are hoping this is helpful for young adults or teens who may not prefer early mornings; families with sports; and folks who work Sunday mornings.

Isn't there room for everyone in one service?

Yes, we can all fit into the sanctuary at 10am. This isn't about being too crowded, but about providing options for growth that isn't happening with only 1 time option.

Do I have to come to two services now?

Absolutely NOT! The two services are very similar; no need to repeat.
